Dear Mary,

We have been using the IG2000 in our mixed animal practice since February of 2001. We continue to be impressed by the superior ability of this machine to promote healing in many species. Nasty bite wounds and old lacerations recover in less time and fewer complications than traditional therapy alone. One of the evil words in the equine world is "proud flesh"- truly a scourge to veterinarians. If we have the opportunity to treat a fresh wound regardless of location- we don't have to worry about proud flesh anymore. When we first purchased our unit, we had skeptics within our own practice. The turning point for them was watching their own degloving cases heal with good cosmetic appearance and the immediate improvement of eye ulcers.

Some of my favorite cases have been acute laminitic horses that I feel benefited from improved blood circulation to the injured lamina as well as pain control in those critical first days. My own horse was retired from cutting horse competition because of painful navicular syndrome. She was lame for 2 years. After a few months of therapy and continued corrective shoeing she shows no soreness. She has not had a treatment in over a year and can once again be ridden.

In summary, we use our IG2000 every day in a wide variety of animals. There are many days we have to wait in line to use the machine and wish we had a second unit. I am privileged to offer superior care to my patients.
